

Your feedback is welcome:


- ~physical access (doorways, parking, etc.)

ELECTION GUIDELINES:

- ✓ Start making posters to put around the school to show others what position you are running for. We can provide materials like markers and poster paper.
- ✓ Make sure your promises are reasonable. No, you can't promise to buy everyone a jacuzzi!
- ✓ You are not permitted to give candy or other rewards to others during this campaign; it will be seen as trying to buy votes. Don't be a crooked politician.
- ✓ Encourage others who wish to be on the SA! Let's be brave and kind.
- ✓ You can only run for one position, so choose wisely.
- ✓ If you are the only person running for a position, people can vote yes or no for you on election day. All students and staff will get a chance to vote, even those running in the election. And yes, you can vote for yourself!
- ✓ Don't vote for someone just because they are your friend. Vote for who you think will do a great job. Voting is private. Don't pry and ask others who they voted for, please.
- ✓ Plan to attend an SA meeting about 3 times/month. Meeting times will probably be on Fridays from about 10:15-10:35. This leaves you with 25 minutes afterwards for recreation (PE/recess time is from 10:15-11:00).
- ✓ When planning events, like decorating or setting things up, be willing to put in the extra time!

Voting day is Friday, Sept. 22nd, so let's have a great campaign September 18-22!
